

New York State and FEMA Open Community Vaccination Sites Statewide

On February 19, New York State [announced](#) its partnership with FEMA to launch a pilot project to establish community vaccination centers (CVCs) in New York State. FEMA will provide resources, operational support, and federal staff to support these centers.

Eligible New Yorkers in the areas of Buffalo, Rochester, Albany and Yonkers can register now.

For the first week of scheduling, appointments at these centers are initially reserved for New Yorkers living in areas with low vaccination rates. After one week, appointments at each site will then be made available to all residents of counties served by the site.
